



In this photo I am helping out at my local church and helping this little girl and her mother, and I think this represents kindness to those around us.


This second photo is me in the Christmas holidays making my family lunch and I think this might represent justice for helping out my family.






Jubilee 2025 – Pilgrims of By Isabelle W + Kara H




PLAN:

• We came up with the idea of a snow globe as the dome represents the inclusion of all of humanity in God's creation.

Inside the globe, the four seasons are present; and they portray the four

figures in the logo.



- We used this rough guide to plan and experiment with different colour schemes and designs.
- We annotated the colours we wished to use to make it easier for us to replicate later in the final project.
- We also measured out where everything should be, including the four quadrants for the seasons, and the base for the snow globe.







PROGRESS:

- We sketched out the initial outline onto a sheet of watercolour paper.
- We measured out the four quadrants and central circle, and the trapezium for the base.
- After measuring, finer detail was added to the base sketch.
- Using our rough guide, we blended four different blues in the sky, one for each segment.

- We added in the brown for the tree which stretches throughout the image, symbolising how our faith is all encompassing in life.
- Each quadrant (and therefore season), represents a different coloured figure within the Jubilee logo.











REPRESENTATION:

- The season of spring on the globe is shown in the top right of the image. This quadrant represents the first figure on the logo red. Not only does the colour of the blossom correspond with the colour of the figure, but also, the main trunk of the tree symbolises the cross in the logo. The blossom clinging to the branches of the tree echoes how the red figure embraces the cross which shows the presence of God in our lives.
- The autumn quarter (bottom right) represents the yellow figure. The leaves falling represent how ephemeral life on earth is, yet, through God's love, the seasons change, and new life begins.
- Summer is found in the bottom left of the project. Its main colours are yellow and green which are embodied in the sunflowers. This denotes the third figure (green) which is embracing the yellow figure. This season also shows how beautiful God's creation is and what He made for is.
- The fourth and final figure (blue) is depicted through the season of winter (top left). The snow, present both on the branches and in the sky, represents how our faith is all around us.







FINAL PRODUCT:

This is the final 3D snow globe. As shown by the front and back photos, the four quadrants/seasons mirror the four different coloured figures on the Jubilee logo. This logo is also present on the front of the globe, positioned in the centre. This is blue-tacked on, and when removed, reveals a stretch of paper with the lyrics to the Jubilee 2025 hymn.

This piece of art represents growth, hope, love and humanity.

• The growth is shown throughout the four seasons, as life is made and taken away, but is then made again in an everlasting cycle.

Hope is shown through winter as the hope of new life brings joy, even when it is cold and dark in life. This is similar to faith, as even when it is dark, faith can turn on the light.

• Love and humanity is shown the logo and lyrics in the centre, as faith is at the centre of our lives, and as we are Imago Dei, we must be stewards of God's creation and His people.











Virtue Signs





This year, we are preparing for the 2025 Jubilee year in the Catholic Church. Our plan is to create signs of the 4 cardinal virtues to put in school, with information, examples of execution, and scripture to inspire students to behave the way St Thomas Aquinas teaches to.

We are also creating the cross and anchor part of the 2025 Jubilee sign. The bending of the cross represents God's imminence, stretching out to all of humanity. The anchor represents the stability of hope and faith; like an anchor to a boat, our faith in God is necessary to maintain stability in our unpredictable lives.

Significance of the pilgrims of hope logo



People

The four figures represent all of humanity coming from the four corners of the earth. They embrace each other to indicate the solidarity and fraternity which should unite all peoples. The figures also remind us that we do not journey through life alone and that we are united with our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Anchor and cross

The anchor symbolises hope as it gives a ship stability and security in the same way that our faith does to us.

The cross is seen to be bending down towards humanity, not leaving humans alone but stretching out to them to offer the certainty of its presence and the security of hope.
