

Synodality is an expression of the Church's style. The word "synod" says it all: it means "journeying together". And the movement is the fruit of docility to the Holy Spirit, who directs this history, in which all have a part to play. #Synod





A Church is a place where everyone is made to feel welcome. It is a vibrant, happy place where people can pray in total silence, in a room full of voices. It is a place where everyone can smile, where everyone can speak up, and where there is a shoulder to cry on and a back to manage our burdens.

If you go out of our way to include everyone, and spread happiness wherever you go, then you can guarantee that you will "never let anyone leave you without leaving happier," as Mother Theresa said. We can spread our love continuously by smiling everyday. Our Church isn't just one building in our community that is designated for worship, it is inside us always, living through the Holy Spirit, keeping our souls alive with the glory of God. He made us for a very special purpose – "before I formed you in the womb, I knew you" - so we could be the best versions of Imago Dei who we want to be, and not be a photocopy.



importantly, loved by God. The church is a home for all of us, but this home is about journeying together; this is literally what synod means after all.






#### Inspirational Synod Quotes

#### Altar and Lectern Design - Tom Bevan

Altar, in religion, a raised structure or place that is used for sacrifice, worship, or prayer. The priest or farther stands behind it reading or talking about quotes from the bible. The altar plays a central role in the celebration of the Eucharist, which takes place at the altar on which the bread and the wine for consecration are placed. Churches generally have a single altar, although in the Western branches of Christianity, as a result of the former abandonment of concelebration of Mass, so that priests always celebrated Mass individually, larger churches have had one or more side chapels, each with its own altar. The main altar was also referred to as the "high altar".

My altar design is mostly white, as it symbolises purity and the fresh start as new people join the church and even the Catholic Christian community. The words 'peace hope and joy' are the main things the synod is aiming to get in the church so we can journey together as a family to support our desire to be more missionary and outward looking. This will give us the faith and goodness to become saints as we are missionary disciples. And, a St Martin quote on how anything can be a prayer if it were offered to God.

Lectern, originally a pedestal-based reading desk with a slanted top used for supporting liturgical books—such as Bibles, missals, and breviaries at religious services; later, a stand that supports a speaker's books and notes. A lectern (from the Latin lectus, past participle of legere, "to read"). Lecterns are in different shapes and sizes depending on the material they are made from. They are sold to churches because they are used to read out the bible.

The following lectern banner design is red for a reason. Red is the colour of fire and so symbolizes the presence of God. It is the liturgical colour for Pentecost. It is considered the colour of the Church, since red can also symbolize the blood of martyrs. The St Martin Aquinas quote — 'What does it take to become a saint. Will it.' — is there to inspire anyone who sees it. For example, on Worship Wednesday or any other time that we come together as a family to pray and reflect, everyone watching will notice the simple quote. 'Will it' implies just going out there and doing whatever we must do to be the best versions of Imago Dei.





## What is my dream for the church?

My dream for the church is to reach families and recover the broken. The Christian life isn't just about believing; it's also about belonging so we should bring the gospel to everyone. Our passion is to assist other churches to discover God's dream for their church. We should live out the virtues of prudence, justice, temperance and courage. "In the one People of God, therefore, let us journey together, in order to experience a Church that receives and lives this gift of unity, and is open to the voice of the Spirit," Pope Francis said as without the spirit there is no synod. The synod's three key words are communion, participation, and mission. He said that communion and mission describe the mystery of the Church. Communion expresses the very nature of the Church, according to the Second Vatican Council. The Synod offers us the opportunity to become a listening Church, to break out of our routine in order to stop and listen, and then to our brothers and sisters, their hopes, the crises of faith around the world. Keeping in mind that God's style is one of closeness, compassion and tenderness, the Pope said the Synod is also an occasion for the People of God not to be aloof but to become a Church of closeness by her very presence, bandaging wounds and healing broken hearts with the balm of God.
